2022-2023 PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Holy Spirit,

Thank you for your ongoing support of our parish. Your commitment and sacrificial giving allows us to continue to be a vibrant and welcoming faith family! I am grateful to be a part of a parish that continues to come together, support what needs to be done, and work towards building a legacy of faith, hope, and love within our Parish family and beyond. With the guidance of our Finance Council, I present to you the year-end report for June 2023 as well as the budget for year-ending June 2024.

The parish change of pastor/administrator took place in mid-April of the past year. The budget for the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year year and the following capital expenditures had already been completed upon my arrival:

2023-2024 Capital Improvements notes:

- Plaza renovation construction is completed. \$200,000 from a NEORSD (Sewer District) grant covered majority of the project. Thank you Fr David Nestler and Finance Council for obtaining this grant. Landscaping/seating planned to be completed Spring of 2024 and will be expenses beyond the budget that may require fundraising/sponsorship.
- Painting of all exterior sides of Church entrance doors is completed under budget.
- Interior school lighting upgrade to energy efficient LED bulbs is near completion. A fire alarm system connecting the school directly to the local fire department is being quoted.
- Mulligan Hall asbestos abatement floor renovation will begin November 13. \$9,000 is set aside for this Mulligan Hall renovation. The Food Pantry ministry has been moved to the Parish Center. The Pantry will operate there during construction and it will be decided if it is to remain there after a period of evaluation.
- The Church bathroom renovation is part of an overall accessibility upgrade to the campus. Other projects that will need funding over the next couple years include accessible exterior entrance, sound system improvements and accessibility of Mulligan Hall. \$10,000 has been raised toward accessibility of the Hall and Church.
- Other non-capital expense improvements completed: Parish Center meeting room new laminate floor, Parish Center 3rd floor retreat area refinishing of bath-tubs, Purchase of new AC units for Parish Center.
- To the extent that these projects come in under budget the money will be saved or used for other necessities.

2022-2023 Budget Notes:

- We operated with a surplus of \$6,355.49 due to our investments performing well. Without investment gains we would have been in an operating deficit of \$44,118.29. Investment income is volatile and cannot always be relied upon to meet our expenses. The school building lease to SMART Academy provided an annual income of \$82,500. Without that income our total deficit would be \$126,618.29. Even without any capital improvements we would still be in a deficit of \$40,038.48. We need to be aware that we are relying on income from outside sources to meet our operating expenses. Our offertory is not meeting the normal expenses to keep our parish in operation.
- There are necessary capital expenses we need to plan on to keep our facilities functioning (replacing old boilers, roofing maintenance, parking lot resurfacing, energy efficiency, safety upgrades including accessibility and asbestos removal). We also need to continue to invest money into the parish's growth (facility improvements, programs for all ages and income levels, both within our parish family and outward to our neighbors). The strategic plan work continues to move forward and will help us prioritize what we do.
- We have to increase revenue by our weekly offertory, fund raising and grants. We cannot contribute to fund raising efforts while decreasing weekly offertory.
- As part of fundraising, please remember us as part of your estate plans. This enables us to plan, and think into the future with confidence and new possibilities.
- We are cutting expenses where possible (utilities, service contracts, technology, etc.), and will continue to look for every possible way to trim or eliminate expenses.
- Online giving is safe and secure and is a *very big help to us administratively*. Please consider moving to online giving.

Please continue to provide support through your prayers and financial planning so that we can build a legacy of faith as a Holy Spirit family!

THE BLACK CATHOLIC MOVEMENT IN CLEVELAND

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. This year, we remember three prominent members of our own Black Catholic Community.



Louis Gleason (October 14, 1929 - April 28, 2022)

Mr. Louis Gleason was the first Director of the Office of Black Catholic Ministries in Cleveland, OH. He worked tirelessly to assist in establishing the National Association of Black Catholic Administrators, and helped the Diocese to establish the Catholic Charities Martin de Porres Center and Fatima Family Center. He was Coordinator of the Campaign for Human Development serving on a number of national, regional and local organization boards and commissions addressing issues related to the black community. Gleason also worked with Archbishop James Lyke in identifying pastoral staff for the urban region.



Aurelia Elliott (May 18, 1929 - March 8, 2013)

Ms. Elliott was a founding member and Grand Lady of the St. Peter Claver Ladies Auxiliary Court 227. She was also a founding member of the Diocesan Black Advisory Board, and the Ohio African American Catholic Commission. She served on City of Cleveland Council for Economic Development and helped coordinate the first diocesan delegation to the National Black Catholic Congress Conference. She was a trailblazer for the Black Catholic Community as well as an advocate for Black Youth and Young Adults.

THE BLACK CATHOLIC MOVEMENT CONTINUED...

With her presence, as well as finances, she supported the implementation of Black Catholic Input (BCI), the Diocesan effort to enhance ministry to youth and young adults. Ms. Elliott worked with Archbishop James Lyke and the City of Cleveland on issues facing the Black Community.



Fr. Gene R. Wilson, C.PP.S. (May 18, 1928 - March 30, 2017)

Fr. Gene Wilson entered the Missionaries of the Precious

Fr. Gene Wilson entered the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in 1950. He earned a bachelor's degree from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, IN and attended Catholic University in Washington, D.C. After ordination on May 28, 1960, he was assigned as the Pastor of the historically Black Catholic Parish at St. Adalbert / Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Church, and was the first Black priest in the Diocese of Cleveland. He brought into St. Adalbert / OLBS Church the cultural impact of the Black Consciousness movement by painting all of the statues in the church brown. He worked with the Commission on Catholic Community Action and was the chairman of the Black Catholic Task Force. Fr. Wilson had a strong devotion to the Holy Spirit and was active in the charismatic movement.



NEW YOUTH INITIATIVES

In order to further engage our elementary school youth in their cultural spirituality, three of the Catholic schools in the Diocese have initiated a Gospel Choir option among their extracurricular activities. This initiative has ignited much excitement and enthusiasm among the Black students. Many thanks to the principals at St. Adalbert School, St. Aloysius School, and St. Mary's School in Akron, OH for their openness in enabling these initiatives. Holy Spirit Parish has just started a youth group that will be meeting monthly. By the grace of God, students are provided with another avenue through which they can share their faith and express their love for their God and their neighbor. Each choir may come to be a bridge from the school to the parish community.

Two part-time Youth Advocates have been hired to assist in engaging the youth in the four African American parishes into a closer walk with Jesus on their faith journey. We are grateful for the professional expertise of Coach Eugene Jones and Ms. Antoinette Smith. Coach Jones, a retired police detective and a certified basketball referee, is a lifetime member of St. Aloysius Parish. Ms. Smith is an Administrative Assistant at the Division of Children and Family Services. She has been a former Youth Minister at St. Agnes / OLOF parish. Both Advocates are even more passionate about their Catholic faith!


