

MAGISTERIUM A

MAGISTERIUM.COM is a free new online resource using artifical intelligence (AI) to generate answers to questions based on the teachings and tradition of the Catholic Church. Question: What does Ordinary **Time mean? Answer:** Ordinary Time is a liturgical season in the Catholic Church that is characterized by the liturgical color green. It is a time outside of the major liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. Ordinary Time is divided into two periods: 1) after the Christmas season until the beginning of Lent, 2) after the Easter season until the beginning of Advent. During Ordinary Time, the Church focuses on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, particularly his ministry and mission on earth. It is a time for growth and reflection, where the faithful are called to live out their faith in their daily lives and strive for holiness. The term "ordinary" does not imply that this time is unimportant, but rather that it is ordered or numbered, as it is counted in weeks rather than being tied to a specific event or mystery of the faith. Through the liturgical celebrations and readings during Ordinary Time, the faithful are invited to deepen their understanding of the Christian life and to grow in their relationship with God and others.

HOLY SPIRIT PARISH PLENARY INDULGENCE

On the 800th Anniversary of the approval of the rule of St Francis (1223), Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence from Dec. 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to Feb. 2, 2024, the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, by praying before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan church. To obtain a plenary indulgence, which is the complete remission of the temporal punishment due to sin, certain requirements must be fulfilled. According to the teachings of the Catholic Church, the faithful must: 1) Have detachment from all sin, even venial. 2) Sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope. Sacramental confession and receiving the Eucharist can happen up to about 20 days before or after the act performed to receive a plenary indulgence. Intentions of Pope prayer: For the intentions of the Holy Father. Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be.In the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. (Those who are sick or unable to participate physically can obtain the indulgence by offering their sufferings up to the Lord or by "carrying out practices of piety.")
