This weekend we welcome the **Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary** to Holy Spirit Church. I wanted to share some more information on this organization that has served in our Catholic Church for over 100 years:

The Knights of Peter Claver is the largest historically African-American Catholic lay organization in the United States. Named after St. Peter Claver, the Spanish Priest who ministered to African slaves. The organization consists of six divisions: Knights of Peter Claver, Knights of Peter Claver Ladies Auxiliary, Junior Knights, Junior Daughters, 4th Degree Knights and Ladies of Grace. The order was founded November 7, 1909 and incorporated July 12, 1911 in Mobile, Alabama. The Meritorious Fourth Degree Knights were authorized in 1917. The Junior Knights were authorized January 14, 1917 and recognized as a Division of the National Council October 1, 1935. The Ladies Auxiliary was authorized August, 1922 and recognized as a Division of the National Council at Galveston, Texas, August, 1926. The Junior Daughters were established in 1930.

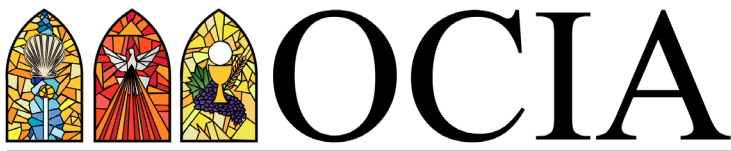
