WHAT IS THE ORIGIN OF GAUDETE SUNDAY? (magisterium.ai generated answer)

Gaudete Sunday, observed as the third Sunday of Advent, takes its name from the Latin word Gaudete ("Rejoice"), the opening word of the Introit for the Mass on that day, drawn from St. Paul's exhortation in his Letter to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice.... The Lord is at hand" (Phil 4:4-5). This naming reflects the Church's liturgical tradition of infusing joy into the otherwise penitential season of Advent, signaling that Christmas—the celebration of Christ's birth—is drawing near, typically just about two weeks away. The origins of Gaudete Sunday are closely tied to the evolution of the Advent season itself, which emerged in the early Church as a period of preparation for the Nativity of Christ. Initially, Advent was a fast lasting forty days, beginning the day after the feast of St. Martin on November 12, and was known as "St. Martin's Lent" as early as the fifth century.2 By the ninth century, the season was shortened to four weeks, as referenced in a letter from Pope St. Nicholas I (858–867) to the Bulgarians. Gaudete Sunday emerged as the "middle" or third Sunday of this four-week season, paralleling Laetare Sunday (the fourth Sunday of Lent). It serves as a joyful interlude, suspending some penitential elements to symbolize the gladness of the Promised Redemption!


