### What is the Pentecost Sequence, *Veni Sancte Spiritus*?

The Pentecost Sequence developed in the medieval Latin West with uncertain authorship and later became fixed in the Roman Missal's assignment for Pentecost and its octave. We chant it because the Church appointed it as the Sequence sung before the Alleluia on Pentecost, and because it gives the faithful a powerful, sung invocation of the Holy Spirit—the "Come" the Apostles prayed for and the Church continues to implore. The sequence illustrates the Spirit's gifts by portraying their practical effects—light for the mind, love for the heart, healing and strength for weakness, and docility that turns us away from sin and toward God. The petitions in *Veni Sancte Spiritus* are the Church's authoritative, Christ-linked invocation of the Father for the Consoler Spirit, and they therefore have the theological value of trinitarian worship and effective asking for the Spirit's sanctifying gifts and transformation. In the sequence's petitions, "Consoler Spirit" is the Holy Spirit as Christ's promised "Paraclete"—the divine Advocate who comes near, comforts, and assists the faithful from within as they await and receive the Spirit's gifts.

**CONCRETE WAYS TO ALLOW THE HOLY SPIRIT TO INCREASE IN YOUR LIFE THIS WEEK**

- 1) Go to the “wellspring” of sacramental grace: prioritize the sacraments you can receive regularly and participate actively in the Church’s sacramental life.
- 2) Make time for Scripture prayer (not just reading): choose a passage and pray it slowly, asking the Spirit to “unveil” Christ to you and guide your response.
- 3) Choose daily “docility moments”: when you notice a prompt toward truth, repentance, patience, or charity, practice consent—small obedience today keeps you open for greater grace.
- 4) Translate grace into charity: deliberately do one “charity in action” decision you wouldn’t otherwise do (a concrete act of service, forgiveness, or moral courage). This aligns with the Spirit’s fruit.
- 5) Talk to the Holy Spirit when you struggle: treat it as a conversation, especially in sin or weakness—keep the dialogue going instead of giving up.

A short prayer you can use:

*“Holy Spirit, living Water in my heart, teach me to pray to the Father and renew me interiorly. Make me docile to your promptings, so I can bear the fruit of charity in action. Amen.”*

The Holy Spirit “increases” in your life as you stay in communion with Christ through the sacraments and prayer, and as you cooperate freely with the Spirit’s promptings toward conversion, truth, and charity.

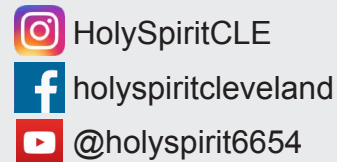
