**SAINTS OF THE WEEK:
St. Charles Lwanga and Companions
June 3, Memorial**

Charles Lwanga was an important leader of the Ugandan martyrs. He served as chief page (prefect) in the court of King Mwanga II of Buganda, and he became known for encouraging the faith and chastity of the young people in his care and for helping catechumens persevere despite the king's pressure to give up their chastity. During the persecution that followed, Lwanga baptized some of the young catechumens and then professed the Christian faith openly, even when death was imminent. 22 Ugandans including St Charles and St Kizito (13-14 years old) were condemned to torture and execution carried out at Namugongo on June 3 1886. St Kizito is the patron saint of children and primary schools. St Charles Lawanga is the patron saint of African Catholic Youth Action, converts, and torture victims.
